	Optional RSC run workshops • 1. RSC workshop: Voice and Impact – This practical session will give participants the opportunity to hone their public speaking and communication skills through theatre-based techniques. The first half of the session will focus on exercises that help improve vocal health, tone and clarity, before exploring exactly what it is that makes a communicator deliver with "impact".
13.00 - 16.00	 2. RSC workshop: Creative Pedagogies - This session will focus on how the RSC's rehearsal room approaches support a creative and critical engagement with cultural capital/literacy that raises moral and social questions to build cultural democracy. It will include dialogic exercises to expose and explore the expectations in the room around Shakespeare's place on schools' curricula. We will explore examples through practice of how creative and playful engagement with complex texts builds transferable skills and competencies of oracy and literacy.
